SCHOOL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. **ENTRIES** may be made by any student at the Elementary or Secondary School level. Exhibitors may make only one entry in any one class.
2. **EXHIBITS MUST BE THE WORK OF THE EXHIBITOR** and made since the previous fair. **Articles should be entered according to the grade the student was in when the project was completed. No entry may be made in a grade higher than the student is currently in.**
3. Students registered in an Elementary or Secondary School in the City of Kawartha Lakes must enter exhibits through School attended. Students who are schooled at home and any other student residing in the City of Kawartha Lakes should contact the Exhibition Office for instructions on how to enter.
4. Entry forms will be forwarded to each school. Teachers may secure additional forms and/or tags at the Exhibition Office, 354 Angeline St. S., Lindsay. Entry forms should be made in duplicate. Submit the original to the Exhibition office and retain a school copy for your future reference.
5. LINDSAY CENTRAL EXHIBITION RESERVES THE RIGHT TO OPEN ALL ENTRY TAGS AFTER JUDGING HAS BEEN COMPLETED.
6. **For all printing, writing, projects and assignments done in class, each teacher is to limit the number of entries to five (5).**
7. **DEADLINE FOR ALL ENTRY FORMS IS 5 p.m. Friday September 14th, 2007.** Completed entry forms may be faxed (705-324-8111) or dropped off during regular office hours, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.
8. Art & Craft exhibits must be delivered to the Exhibition Hall **between 3:00 p.m. and 7:45 p.m.** Monday September 17th.
9. Flowers, Vegetables and Farm Produce exhibits are to be delivered to the Exhibition Hall **on Tuesday September 18th before 7:45 p.m.** with tags securely attached. See pages 14 - 16.
10. While the Committee will take every possible precaution to secure the safety of articles sent to the Exhibition, the owners themselves must take the risk of exhibiting. Should any article be accidentally damaged, lost or stolen, the Committee will give all the assistance in their power towards its recovery but will not make any payment for the value thereof.
11. Prize money will be distributed by the schools. If your money is not received by November 1st, please advise the Exhibition office.
12. The judges reserve the right to withhold a prize if the exhibit is deemed unworthy.
13. **Exhibition Hall closes at 7:00 p.m. Sunday September 23rd, 2007.** Exhibits may be picked up on Monday September 24th between 10 a.m. and 7 p.m. or during the remainder of the week between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m.

HELPFUL HINTS!

- 1. How do I choose my projects?**
Projects may be chosen from the entry list your teacher gave you in June, or your new teacher gave you in September.
- 2. How will my project be judged?**
Projects are judged on neatness, creativity, and following the directions. Make sure you check the limits and type of materials required from the entry list. This must be your own work.
- 3. How do I enter my project?**
Tell your teacher you wish to enter your project. He or she will give you a student number. He or she will also give you a tag that you should fill out, neatly and accurately.
- 4. How do I fill in my tags?**
Print neatly the class number and the name of the project from the entry list, your student number, your name and your grade on the tag. (Your teacher will have stamped the name of the school on the tag.) Securely fasten the tag to your project.
- 5. When do I bring in my project to the fair?**
Bring it to the Exhibition Hall on Monday September 17th, 2007 **after 3 PM and before 8 PM. After 8 PM is too late!!**
- 6. When can I see my project after it has been judged?**
The display area is open every day during the Lindsay Exhibition. The Exhibition Hall is open Wednesday from 12 noon until 9:30 PM, Thursday from 10 AM until 9:30 PM, Friday and Saturday from 10 AM until 10:30 PM and Sunday from 10 AM until 7:00 PM.
- 7. The Junior Arts and Crafts will be available for pick up on Monday September 24th, 2007 between 10 AM and 7 PM or during the remainder of the week between 9 AM and 5 PM.**
- 8. If I have won a prize when do I receive it?**
As soon as all the prize money won by your school have been calculated the money will be sent to your school office and your school will give it to you. Be patient. This may take 2-4 weeks after the fair is over.



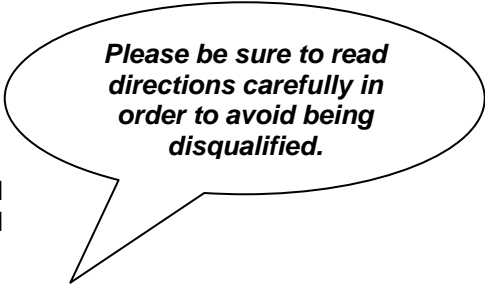



BENEFIT OF BEES:

Bees are necessary to cross-pollinate many plants. Without cross-pollination, we would be unable to produce large crops of fruit (apples, pears, peaches, cherries, strawberries, raspberries, cranberries, blueberries, etc). Bees also cross-pollinate many farm crops and greatly increase their yield (clover, canola, soybeans, etc). Many home garden vegetables also depend on bees for pollination (beans, cucumbers, pumpkins, squash, currants, melons, etc). Although honey bees are mainly kept for the honey and wax they produce their chief benefit to us is pollination. Many wild bees also pollinate our crops (bumblebees, leaf cuter bees, etc). Honey bees are mainly kept for the honey they produce and are also used to gather pollen for food and propolis (a resinous substance from plants) which is used by bees to seal up cracks, etc. in their home. Propolis is used by humans for medical purposes. Bee sting venom is also used for medical purposes.
