HOMECRAFT DIVISION

RULES & REGULATIONS:

1. **EXHIBITOR:** Each Exhibitor must pay a \$10.00 administration fee. Administration fee must accompany all entry forms except in Special Needs (9000 - 9024), Manor (9101- 9157) and Youth (1516 - 1533) classes.
 2. **ENTRY CLOSING DATE:** Closing date for Homecraft entry forms is 5 PM **FRIDAY SEPTEMBER 10th, 2010.** Entry forms received after this time will Be charged AN ADDITIONAL LATE FEE OF \$5.00. ABSOLUTELY NO ENTRY FORMS WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER 5 PM, FRIDAY SEPTEMBER 17th, 2010.
 3. **ENTRIES ALLOWED:** Exhibitors may make **“ONE ENTRY”** only and receive **“ONE PRIZE”** only in each class.
 4. **TAGS:** Entry tags for those whose entry forms are received by the regular closing date (Friday September 10th) will be ready for pick up at the Exhibition Office after 9 AM Friday September 17th. Those who have paid a late fee will be advised when their entry tags will be available. Tags may not be picked up at the time of bringing in entry forms. Tags must be attached to The exhibit with flap closed. LINDSAY CENTRAL EXHIBITION RESERVES THE RIGHT TO OPEN ALL ENTRY TAGS AFTER JUDGING HAS BEEN COMPLETED.
 5. **BRINGING EXHIBITS:** Exhibits should be brought to the *Farmers' Mutual Exhibition Building* **between 9 AM and 8 PM** on **Monday** September 20. ***Judging will begin Tuesday September 21, 2010 at 10 AM.***
- **change NOTE: Manors & Special Needs entries must be in place by 2 PM Monday September 20th, 2010.**
6. **PICKING UP EXHIBITS:** Exhibitors must present their Exhibitor Card to claim their articles. Exhibits may not be removed until ***Monday September 27th between 10 AM and 7 PM.***
 7. **EXHIBITS SHOWN IN PREVIOUS YEARS** will be disqualified and will not be judged. Articles must have been made since September 2009, with the exception of quilts, which must have been made since September 2008 and may be exhibited in two consecutive years.
 8. All Articles for competition must be strictly the production of the person making the entry, **unless otherwise stated**, and may not be sold in the exhibit hall.

PICK UP ~ Monday September 27th ~ 10 a.m. to 7 p.m.

9. Articles soiled or defaced by wear are not eligible for competition
10. **ABSENCE OF COMPETITION:** In the absence of competition in any section or if articles exhibited are of inferior quality, the judge will award only such premiums as they deem the exhibits merit. The judges are particularly requested to conform to this regulation.
11. **FRAUD:** Upon the discovery of any fraud, deception or dishonest practice, either in the preparation, ownership or any fraudulent representation concerning any article exhibited, the Committee shall have the power to withhold the payment of any or all the premiums awarded to the Exhibitor proven to be guilty of such an offense.
12. **RESPONSIBILITY:** While the Committee members will take every possible precaution under the circumstances to ensure the safety of articles sent to the Exhibition, the owners themselves must take the risk of exhibiting and should any article be accidentally damaged, lost or stolen, the Committee members will give all the assistance in their power towards its discovery, but no payment for the value thereof will be made.
13. **NO "FOR SALE":** No advertising or signs will be allowed on exhibits. Exhibits are not to be sold at or during the fair in the exhibit hall.
14. The Homecraft Committee reserves the right to interpret their own rules and regulations.
15. Please bring EXHIBITOR CARD when picking up exhibits.
16. Article means **one** item as specified.
17. **Farmers' Mutual Exhibition Building** will be open Monday September 27th from 10 AM until 7 PM for pickup.
18. Perishable articles not picked up on MONDAY SEPTEMBER 27th will be discarded without notification to the exhibitor.
19. "Size" where specified is important - *please read rules carefully.*

8236 BANANA RAISIN MUFFINS - 5, using the recipe below

1 1/4 cups all purpose flour	1/4 cup liquid honey
2 tsp baking powder	1 egg
1/4 tsp baking soda	1 tbsp milk
1/2 tsp salt	1/3 cup oil
1/2 cup raisins	1/4 tsp vanilla
1 cup mashed ripe bananas	

Combine dry ingredients and raisins. Stir together bananas, honey, egg, milk, oil and vanilla. Add liquid ingredients to dry ingredients. Stir just to blend. Fill greased muffins tins 3/4 full. Bake at 400° for 18-20 minutes, or until lightly browned. Makes 12 muffins.

8237 HONEY HAWAIIAN DATE LOAF, using the recipe below

1/4 cup margarine	1 tsp salt
1/2 cup honey	1/2 tsp baking soda
1 egg	14 oz can crushed pineapple, drained
2 cups sifted all purpose flour	2 tsp vanilla
1 tbsp baking powder	3/4 cup chopped dates

Heat oven to 325°. Grease (not oil) bottom only of 9" x 5" pan. Cream margarine and honey together. Add egg and beat well. Sift together flour, baking powder, salt and baking soda. Add to creamed mixture alternately with pineapple. Mix well. Fold in vanilla and dates. Pour into prepared pan. Bake for 1 hour or until toothpick inserted in centre comes out clean. Cool 10 minutes. Remove from pan.

8238 HONEY CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIES - 5, using the recipe below

1/2 cup honey	1/2 tsp soda
1/2 cup butter	1/4 tsp baking powder
1 egg	1/2 tsp salt
1/2 tsp vanilla	1/2 cup chopped nuts
1 1/2 cups flour	1 cup chocolate chips

Cream together honey and butter. Add egg and vanilla. Sift together flour, soda, baking powder and salt and add to mixture. Add nuts and chocolate chips. Drop by spoonfuls on cookie sheet. Bake at 350° for 12 minutes.

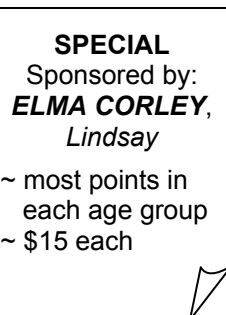

8950 KNITTED AFGHAN / CUDDLE BLANKET

Materials

~ 4 ply worsted weight yarn

~ 6mm needles

~ size - approximately 32" x 34"

Pattern - your choice or use the following

Directions

Cast on 144 stitches. Pattern is a multiple 11 sts. + 1.

Row 1: k1, *yo, k3, k2 tog, k2 tog, k3, yo, k1.

Repeat from * to end.

Row 2: Purl

Row 3: Knit

Repeat rows 1-3 until desired length - approximately 32" to 34"

Cast off on knit row.

8951 CROCHETED BLANKET

Materials

~ 4 skeins chunky yarn (600 yds total)

~ size J crochet hook

~ approximately 30" x 30"

Pattern - your choice or use the following

(To use different yarns and hooks or to change the size, just make the foundation chain the desired length by having a multiple of 3 plus 2 chains)

Directions

Chain 83

Row 1: (right side): In 5th ch from hook work (sc, hdc, dc); *sk next 2 chs. in next ch work (sc, hdc, dc); repeat from * across to last 3 chs, sk next 2 chs, dc in last ch. Ch 2, turn

Row 2: In next dc work (sc, hdc, dc); * sk next 2 sts. in next dc work (sc, hdc, dc); rep from * to beg 4 skipped chs; sk next 2 chs, dc in next ch. Ch 2, turn

Row 3: (right side): * In next dc work (sc, hdc, dc); sk next 2 sts; rep from * to turning ch-2; dc in 2nd ch of turning ch. Ch 2, turn
Repeat row 3 for desired length. At end of last row, do not ch 2, do not turn. Finish off.

OAAS Championship Quilt Competition

A Grand Champion and a Reserve Grand Champion hand quilted quilt will be chosen from the first and second place prize winners.

All Quilts will be judged in their respective classes first. Entries must be solely made and hand quilted by the exhibitor. Entries must be a minimum of 72" x 90" (smaller quilts will not be eligible to proceed to the next level of competition).

The Grand Champion Quilt will compete at the District Level in October and the District winner will compete in the OAAS Championship Competition at the Provincial Level in February.

Upon having an entry in the OAAS Quilt Competition the Exhibitor agrees to participate in any promotional activities related to the competition.

The first place winning quilts from the District Competitions are eligible to enter the OAAS Championship Quilt Competition at their Annual Convention.

The OAAS will award prize money of:

1st - \$25 2nd - \$15 3rd - \$10

to Exhibitors of winning quilts at each District Competition.

The entry judged *BEST OF SHOW* at the February Convention will be declared the *ONTARIO ASSOCIATION OF AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES CHAMPIONSHIP QUILT*. A \$500 GRAND PRIZE will be awarded and the Exhibitor will retain ownership of the quilt. A certificate and ribbon will also be awarded to the winner.

OAAS Machine-Quilted Quilt/Wall Hanging Championship Competition

Articles eligible for this competition will come from winning entries from all machine quilted classes and the following rules will apply.

1. Entries must be solely made and machine quilted by the exhibitor and exhibited and judged at a local OAAS fair to be eligible.
